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October Review

Coming from a difficult September that saw two losses and one draw, October brought signs of improvement, but also clear lessons and renewed hunger.

The Mabanga Boys fought hard across three competitive fixtures, recording three draws in the MTN Super League. While progress was visible, the results still fell short of the ambitions of the team, the technical bench, and our passionate supporters.

The month was a reminder of the club's determination to compete at the highest level. Just last season, Kansanshi Dynamos shined in the National Division One League, earning a return to the top flight.

Now, the mission is to translate that fearless spirit into consistent results in the MTN Super League.



Match Recap – October Fixtures Week 7 vs Red Arrows (Home)

Kansanshi Dynamos showed intent and dominance, taking the lead in the 40th minute through Rodgers Lukonde. However, a second-half equalizer in the 56th minute denied the team maximum points, ending in a 1–1 draw.

Rescheduled Week 10 vs Napsa Stars (Away)

In Lusaka, the Mabanga Boys again struck first, this time through Francisco Madinga in the 49th minute. But Napsa Stars hit back in the 77th minute, forcing another 1–1 draw and delaying our first win of the season.

Week 9 vs Mines United (Home)

Despite Mines United entering the match with just one point, they took the lead in the 70th minute. The boys responded quickly, equalizing in the 75th minute through Willy Bokingo, assisted by debutant Brian Mwila. The match ended 1–1, a result that sparked strong emotions from the stands, reflecting the passion and expectations surrounding the club.



Looking Ahead: Eyes on November

Three games, three points, three goals, and many lessons.

Although October did not deliver the victories the Club and our supporters are fighting for, the improvement from September is clear. The team remains committed to sharpening our finishing, staying focused under pressure, and rewarding the unwavering support from our fans.

The boys return in November hungry for the first win of the campaign and determined to reignite the Mabanga spirit that pushes Kansanshi forward.





Coach Reflects on October & Sets Focus on a Strong November Push

As October comes to a close, Head Coach Zeddy Sileti has shared his thoughts on the team's performance and the road ahead.

Reflecting on the recent home fixture, the coach expressed disappointment at not securing all three points, especially in front of the home fans.

"Playing at home, picking just one point is not enough. We planned to collect maximum points. We created a lot of chances, more than enough to win, but we didn't take them. Our opponents had one clear chance, scored, and that created pressure for us. We equalized, but again failed to convert the opportunities for the second goal."

Despite the frustration, Coach Sileti remains optimistic and determined, noting that the team showed strong attacking intent and will use the break to regroup and sharpen finishing in front of goal.

"This is football. We need to sit down, evaluate, and plan again. The boys are working hard, now it's about converting dominance into results."

With November fixtures on the horizon, the technical bench is focused on turning chances into victories and pushing the team up the table.

"We've seen growth and we know where to improve. Our target is clear, November must be a stronger month for us. We believe we'll come back better and deliver the results our supporters deserve."

As the team prepares for the next round of matches, the message is clear, regroup, refocus, and rise stronger.

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WILLIAM “MACHINE” DAKA: BUILT FOR GREATNESS

Some players are born with talent. Others earn their names through sheer sweat, hunger and relentless drive. William “Machine” Daka belongs to the second category, the kind of footballer who works quietly, pushes consistently, and lets the pitch speak for him.

At just 20 years old, the Young Kansanshi United striker has already carved a reputation as one of the brightest emerging talents in the set-up. This season, he sits proudly as the team’s leading scorer with 4 goals, a reflection not only of ability but of growth, confidence, and the belief the club has placed in him.

A Dream Sparked by Chipolopolo Glory

William’s journey began like many Zambian football stories do, with a young boy watching heroes lift the nation’s pride. When Zambia won the Africa Cup of Nations, William wasn’t just celebrating. He was imagining himself there one day. The joy, the unity, the pride, it planted a seed.

“That AFCON win made me want to play football seriously,” he recalls.

From the dusty grounds where boys develop grit and instinct, William’s talent caught attention early. He joined Candies Academy, where fundamentals were shaped and passion grew. But it was in 2013, when he made the switch to Young Kansanshi United, that his real football education began.



A Decade of Growth in Gold and Black

Eleven years later, William is no longer just a prospect, he is a foundational product of the Young Kansanshi system. He has grown through age groups, sharpened under structured coaching, and learned what it means to fight for a badge, a dream, and a future.

"I am not the same player I was. My scoring has improved a lot. The coaches and the facilities here push me to become better every day."

Young Kansanshi United has invested in his development, technically, tactically, physically and mentally. He has responded with maturity, absorbing lessons, staying disciplined, and working on his greatest strength: finishing.

Why They Call Him "Machine"

Nicknames are earned on the pitch. His?

Machine.

Not because of his size, but because of how he plays:

Relentless. Direct. Powerful. Composed. Hunger in the eyes, purpose in every sprint.

Inspired by former Chipolopolo star Muyuka, William studies movement, timing, and finishing, the art of being in the right place, at the right time, with the right instinct.



Ambition That Doesn't Hide

William's ambitions are straightforward, bold and honest, exactly what you want from a young striker:

"I want to play in the Zambian Super League, then go abroad. And also play for the national team."

Not hope. Intention.

He believes in gradual growth, make an impact locally, earn the right to chase bigger dreams internationally, and eventually, wear the green shirt of Zambia.

A Message to the Fans

Behind every breakthrough player is a community that believed first. William knows this and recognises the role of the supporters who cheer, guide, and sometimes challenge the boys to be better.

"Fans should support us in good and bad times. Their belief motivates us."

He understands accountability. He also understands loyalty, something many senior professionals learn much later.

The Road Ahead

Football is a journey of steps, some high, some testing. But William "Machine" Daka is built for it. He has tasted academy football, grown through youth structures, and is now translating years of training into goals and confidence.

This is not the finished product. This is the beginning of a striker rising with intention, discipline and hunger.

With four goals already and a mindset driven by improvement, William is on the path, and Young Kansanshi United continues to stand as a platform that shapes not just players, but believers, dreamers and achievers.

Machine is not just a nickname.

It's a mentality.

And this machine is just getting started.
