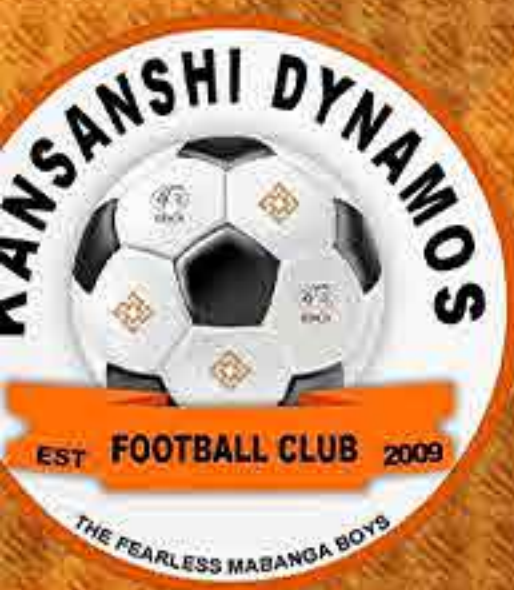

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NOVEMBER IN REVIEW

November was a month of mixed results for the Mabanga Boys, with three league matches producing a win, a draw, and a loss. Our first victory of the season came this month, in front of our home supporters at Independence Stadium. Kansanshi Dynamos edged Nchanga Rangers 1–0, thanks to Willy Bokingo, who came off the bench at halftime and found the breakthrough in the 68th minute. It was also a period of transition on the technical bench. Coach Yoram Kasempa, who joined the club midweek as Second Assistant Coach, stepped in to lead the team following the departure of Coach Zeddy Saileti.



Our next assignment saw us travel to Arthur Davies Stadium, where the boys suffered a 2–0 defeat to Power Dynamos. Before our final match of the month, the club appointed Coach Fathi Mohammed as head coach. Under his guidance, the team produced a solid performance and held FC MUZA to a 0–0 draw at Independence Stadium. Overall, November brought challenges, progress, and a glimpse of the resilience within the squad as we continue pushing forward.



NEW TECHNICAL TEAM, NEW AMBITION: KANSANSHI DYNAMOS' NOVEMBER REVIEW



November was a month of change, challenge, and renewed ambition for Kansanshi Dynamos FC. Amidst a transitional period on the technical bench, the club experienced its first win of the season, a tough loss, and a hard-fought draw, all under the guidance of coaches stepping into new roles.

Midway through the month, Coach Yoram Kasempa, a proud son of the North-Western Province, briefly took charge on an interim basis. Joining the team on a Wednesday, Kasempa led the Mabanga Boys in two matches, including a historic 1–0 home win over Nchanga Rangers, where Willy Bokingo scored the decisive goal.

He also managed the team in a 2–0 defeat to Power Dynamos away from home. Working closely with Coach Buchizya Mfuné and Goalkeeper Coach Humphrey Kapoma, Kasempa's leadership brought stability and a local connection that resonated with the players and fans.

Later in the month, the club officially unveiled its new technical bench, introducing Head Coach Mohamed Fathi and First Assistant Coach Dennis Makinka. Speaking after joining, Fathi emphasized the challenge ahead but also the potential within the team:

“Kansanshi Dynamos is a big organisation, but currently not in the right position. Our aim is to take the team where it deserves to be, at the top of the league. We have a plan with the President and the executive. This season, our target is to reach the top eight, but we will push to aim for the top four. With

Makinka, who recently led Zambia's Under-17 team at the FIFA World Cup, echoed the excitement of joining the club:

"Kansanshi Dynamos is a big team with big ambitions. This community is growing fast, and I'm happy to be here. I want to give my best and be part of a generation that will make a big impact this season. The fans here are amazing, the atmosphere has always been electric, and now we want to give them positive results. Working with Coach Fathi is exciting; we've known each other for years, and now we are combining ideas to deliver results."

The new duo oversaw their first match, a 0-0 draw against FC MUZA at Independence Stadium. Though the game ended without goals, it reflected early signs of organization, discipline, and a collective spirit under the revamped technical team.

As November came to a close, Kansanshi Dynamos showed glimpses of resilience, ambition, and focus. The month may have been transitional, but with new leadership, renewed determination, and the support of their passionate fans, the Mabanga Boys are laying the foundation for a strong push in the rest of the season.





COACH KASEMPA: "THIS IS MY HOME"

November also highlighted the influence of Coach Yoram Kasempa, who stepped into the technical bench at a critical time for the club. Joining the team on a Wednesday, he was immediately entrusted with leading the Mabanga Boys on an interim basis as the club navigated a transition. A proud son of the North-Western Province, Coach Kasempa expressed how meaningful it was to join Kansanshi Dynamos.

"I am from this province. Being here feels right... this is my team, this is my home, and I'm happy to be part of Kansanshi Dynamos," he shared.

Alongside Coach Buchizya Mfunne (Physical Trainer) and Coach Humphrey Kapoma (Goalkeeper Trainer), he took charge of two matches in November.

His first match delivered a historic moment, Kansanshi Dynamos' first win of the season, a 1–0 home victory over Nchanga Rangers, with Willy Bokingo scoring in the 68th minute.

In his second match, away to Power Dynamos at Arthur Davies Stadium, the team fought hard but suffered a 2–0 defeat.

Despite the mixed results, Coach Kasempa's leadership, passion, and deep connection to the region brought renewed energy to the team during a crucial phase.

A Five-Star Statement at Home (Week 10)
