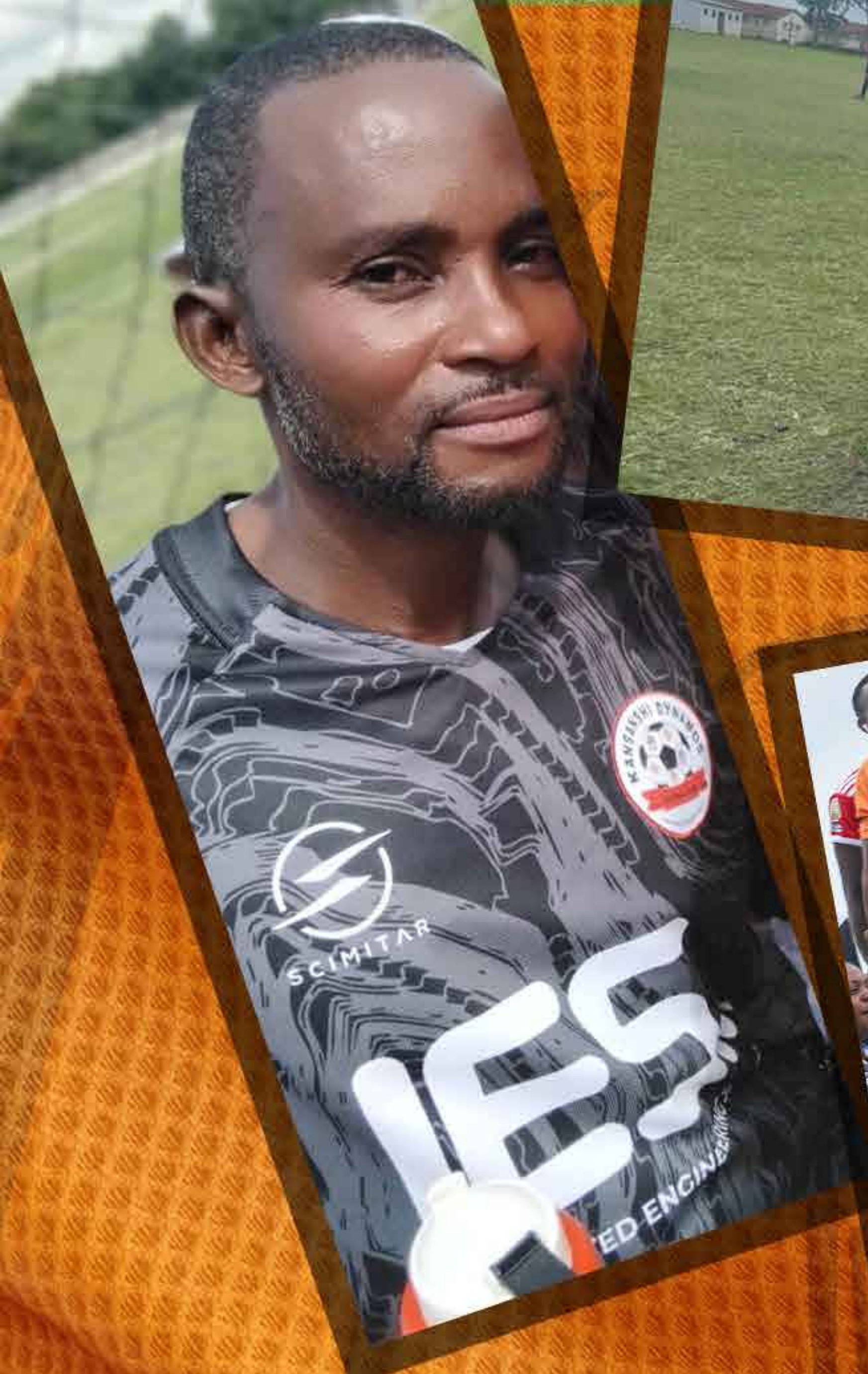

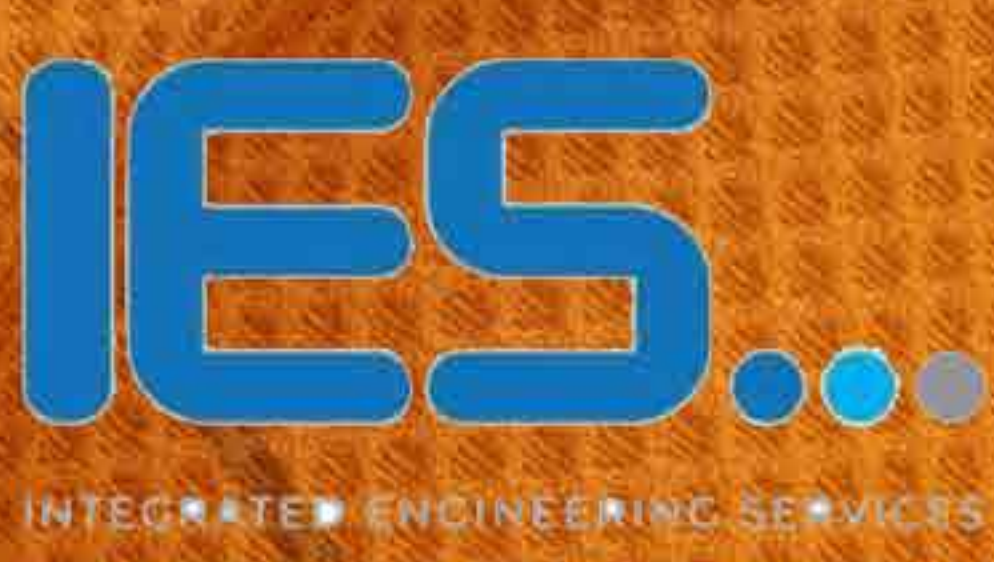

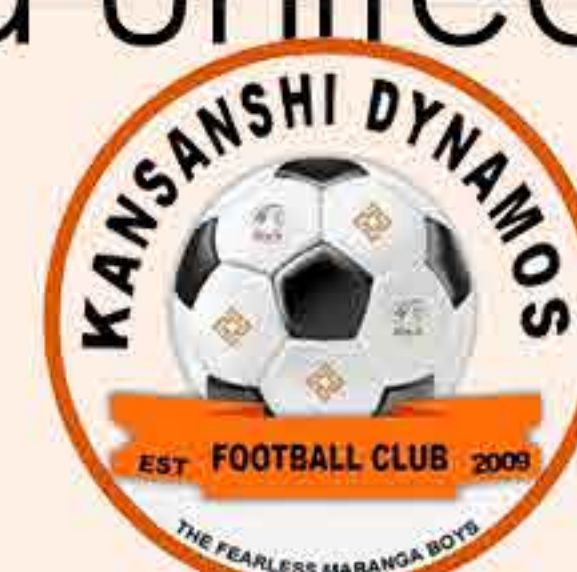

December & First Half of the 2025/26 Season Review

December was a relatively quiet month for Kansanshi Dynamos FC, with the team playing just two fixtures in the MTN Super League as the year came to a close.

The first fixture was an away encounter against Green Buffaloes FC in Lusaka, which ended in a 1–1 draw during Week 14 of the league. Willy Bokingo was on target as the Mabanga Boys shared the spoils on the road.

The second match saw Kansanshi Dynamos face ZESCO United FC in a rescheduled Week 12 fixture, with the Solwezi-based side falling to a 2–0 defeat away from home.



After 14 matches, Kansanshi Dynamos sit 15th on the league table, having recorded one win, eight draws, and five defeats. The team has scored six goals and conceded 12, figures that reflect a competitive side that has struggled to turn performances into decisive results.

Beyond December, 2025 was a year of mixed emotions for the club. Kansanshi Dynamos finished second in the National Division One League, securing promotion back to the MTN Super League, a significant milestone for the club.

The return to top-flight football has proven demanding, but the season remains a work in progress. As the club moves into 2026, the focus is on improving execution, increasing efficiency at both ends of the pitch, and converting performances into results as the first half of the season concludes.



Rodgers Lukonde: Leading Through a Difficult Phase

As captain, Rodgers Lukonde has been at the centre of a challenging opening phase of the 2025/26 MTN Super League season, leading the team through the first 14 matches while keeping focus on what still lies ahead.

Lukonde admits that the opening stretch of the season has not gone according to expectations, but insists that effort and commitment within the group remain strong. For him, moments like these demand greater unity and hard work from everyone in the dressing room.

"We are trying our best, but we need to push more," Lukonde says. "Now that things are not okay, that's when we are supposed to work together and even harder."

Within the squad, Lukonde describes a group that continues to encourage one another, with senior players playing a key role in guiding the younger members of the team.

"We keep encouraging each other and supporting the young players," he explains. "There is still a lot to achieve."

With three matches still to be played before the conclusion of the first half of the season, Lukonde emphasises the importance of staying focused and taking each game as it comes.

"Every point is important for us," he says. "We want to take each game one at a time."

He concluded with a message to the supporters, acknowledging their importance during a difficult period.

"We plead with our fans to continue supporting us," Lukonde adds. "Without them, we can definitely fail."

As the team approaches the final games of the first half of the season, Lukonde's message is clear: unity, effort, and belief remain central as the squad continues to work towards better results.

The 2025 season has not unfolded as Kansanshi Dynamos would have hoped, and midfielder Kizito Keziron does not shy away from that reality. After 14 matches played, the team has managed just one victory, suffered five defeats, and drawn the eight fixtures, a run of results that has left the club searching for consistency.

For Kizito, the numbers only tell part of the story. While results have been disappointing, performances on the pitch have often suggested a team capable of much more.

"The truth is, we didn't do well in the first round," Kizito admits. "But it's not that we play bad football. It's the small details that are costing us."

One of those details, he explains, has been the team's struggle in front of goal. Despite creating chances and competing well in matches, the lack of goals has prevented the team from turning promising performances into wins. Kizito is clear that responsibility lies with the players themselves, from midfield through to attack.

Returning to the MTN Super League has also brought renewed scrutiny, but Kizito dismisses the suggestion that the level is too high for the team. Having previously competed well against Super League opposition, he believes excuses have no place in the dressing room.

"I don't think the league is too big for us," he says. "We've shown before that we can compete. It's up to us to work harder and fix those small things."

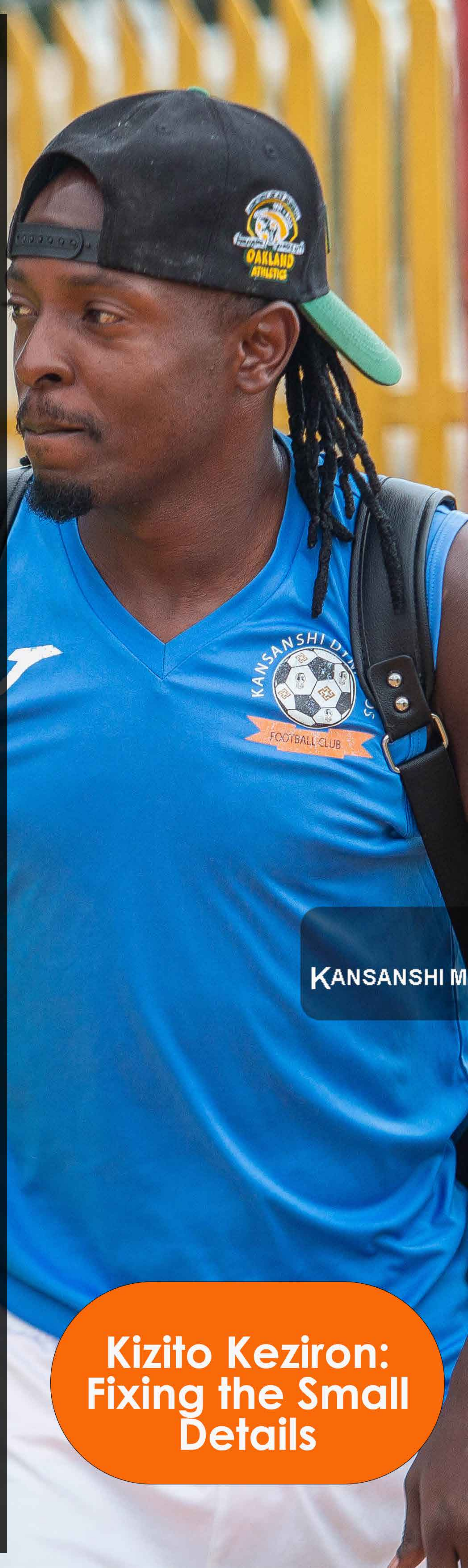
As the season has progressed, changes within the technical bench have brought signs of improvement. The team has avoided defeat in recent matches, offering encouragement, but Kizito remains realistic. Draws alone, he notes, are not enough when the club is still not in a safe position.

On a personal level, the Ugandan midfielder is equally honest about his own form. He acknowledges that he has not matched last season's performances, but insists that football is always about collective effort rather than individual focus. Better coordination between midfield and attack, improved finishing, and defensive discipline are areas he believes will make the difference.

Despite the challenges, Kizito remains appreciative of the supporters who have continued to stand by the team.

"They shouldn't give up on us," he says. "We are working hard, and we want to start giving them the joy they deserve."

With the second round and remaining fixtures ahead, the message from the dressing room is clear: the work continues, unity remains key, and the focus is firmly on turning effort into results.

Mathews Mutambo: "It Starts With Us as Players"

Defender Mathews Mutambo speaks with honesty about a season that has not met expectations, making it clear that responsibility rests squarely with the players themselves.

The first half of the 2025/26 season has not gone according to plan for Kansanshi Dynamos. With three matches still to be played before the conclusion of the first round, the team finds itself in a position it did not anticipate at the start of the campaign.

"To tell the truth, we have not done well so far," Mutambo admits. "This is not how we planned our first round to go."

For Mutambo, there are no excuses. He acknowledges the disappointment felt by supporters and understands why patience has been tested.

"The supporters are not happy, and we understand that," he says. "When results are not coming, it hurts everyone."

Rather than looking outward, Mutambo explains that the focus within the squad has been on self-reflection and accountability. Players continue to push each other, holding honest discussions about performance, discipline, and commitment, with the aim of correcting what has gone wrong.

As the team prepares for the remaining three matches of the first half of the season, unity within the squad remains central. Mutambo believes that improvement will only come if the players remain together and continue working as one.

"It's up to us as players to stay united and work harder," he says. "If we do that, the results will start coming."

With the season still in progress, Mutambo insists that belief has not been lost inside the dressing room. The focus now is on finishing the first half of the campaign strongly and building momentum for the second round. He ended with a direct message to the supporters.

"They should keep believing in us and supporting us," Mutambo says. "We are doing everything we can, and we will keep pushing to give them something to celebrate."

As 2025 came to a close, Kansanshi Queens FC remained firmly in contention during the first half of the 2025/26 FAZ Women’s National League season in the Northern Zone.

The Queens are currently unbeaten since Match Day One, when they opened their campaign at home against Leopards Queens, highlighting consistency and resilience across the first half of the season.

Sitting 3rd on the 13-team log, the team is just five points behind the league leaders, keeping promotion ambitions very much alive. Defensively, Kansanshi Queens have recorded 6 clean sheets from 13 matches played, while Theresa Nayame leads the league’s goal-scoring chart with 13 goals.

As the league resumes, the task for Coach Mwape “Dida” Kasunka and his squad is to maintain momentum and push strongly for Super League qualification.

Competitive action resumes on January 17, when Kansanshi Queens host Nakonde Titans FC in Solwezi.

Young Kansanshi are currently into the second half of the 2025/26 season, having already played two matches in the second round of the FAZ North-Western Provincial Division One League.

League action is set to continue from January 17, as the team looks to build momentum in the remainder of the campaign.

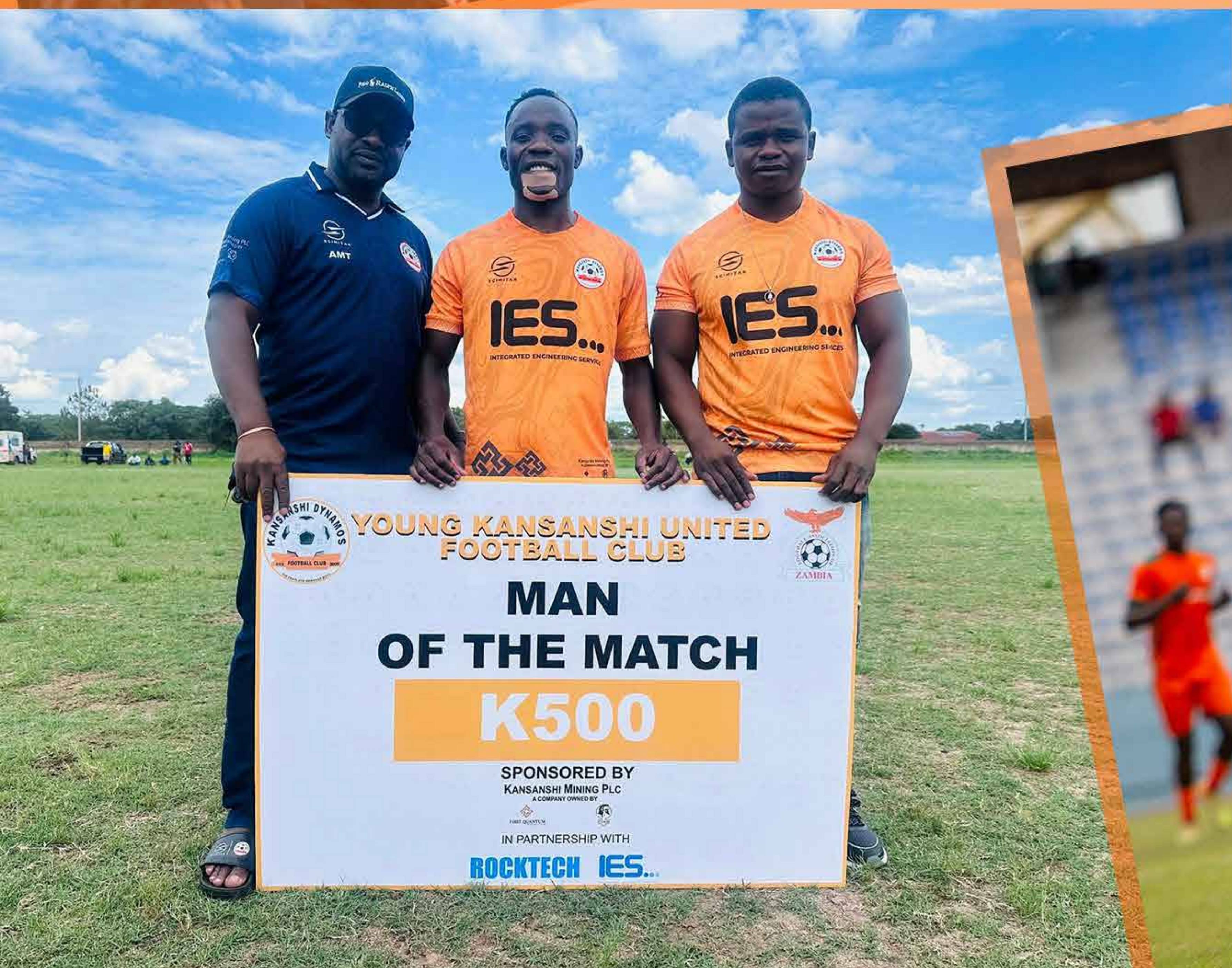
