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February Match Review

February was a busy month for Kansanshi Dynamos Football Club, with the team playing five matches during the period and collecting five points from a possible fifteen. The first fixture was away against Kabwe Warriors in Kabwe. Kansanshi Dynamos came from behind to secure a point on the road after Brighton Kabumba came on in the second half to score the equaliser for the Mabanga Boys. The team then returned home to face Zanaco FC in Solwezi, where Kansanshi Dynamos delivered an exciting performance in front of the home supporters. Francisco Madinga scored the only goal of the match to secure all three points for the Solwezi side.

Next was an away fixture against Konkola Blades. Kansanshi Dynamos started the match strongly and took the lead through Kajonji Mwepu, who had just returned from injury. However, the hosts responded with two goals to turn the game around and claim victory.

The Mabanga Boys then hosted Mutondo Stars at home in a match that ended in a draw. After going behind, Kansanshi Dynamos fought back with Kajonji Mwepu scoring the equaliser to ensure the team shared the points.

The final match of the month was away against Green Eagles. Kansanshi Dynamos suffered a narrow 2-1 defeat despite Mathews Banda finding the back of the net for the visitors.

Overall, the team showed moments of resilience during the month and will look to build on these performances as the season progresses.



Kansanshi Dynamos captain Rodgers Lukonde says the team remains fully focused on improving its position as the MTN Super League season enters a crucial phase. After 22 matches played, the Mabanga Boys currently sit 14th on the table with 22 points, having recently moved out of the relegation zone. While the team has managed to step away from the drop zone, Lukonde admits it is not the position the club wants to be in.

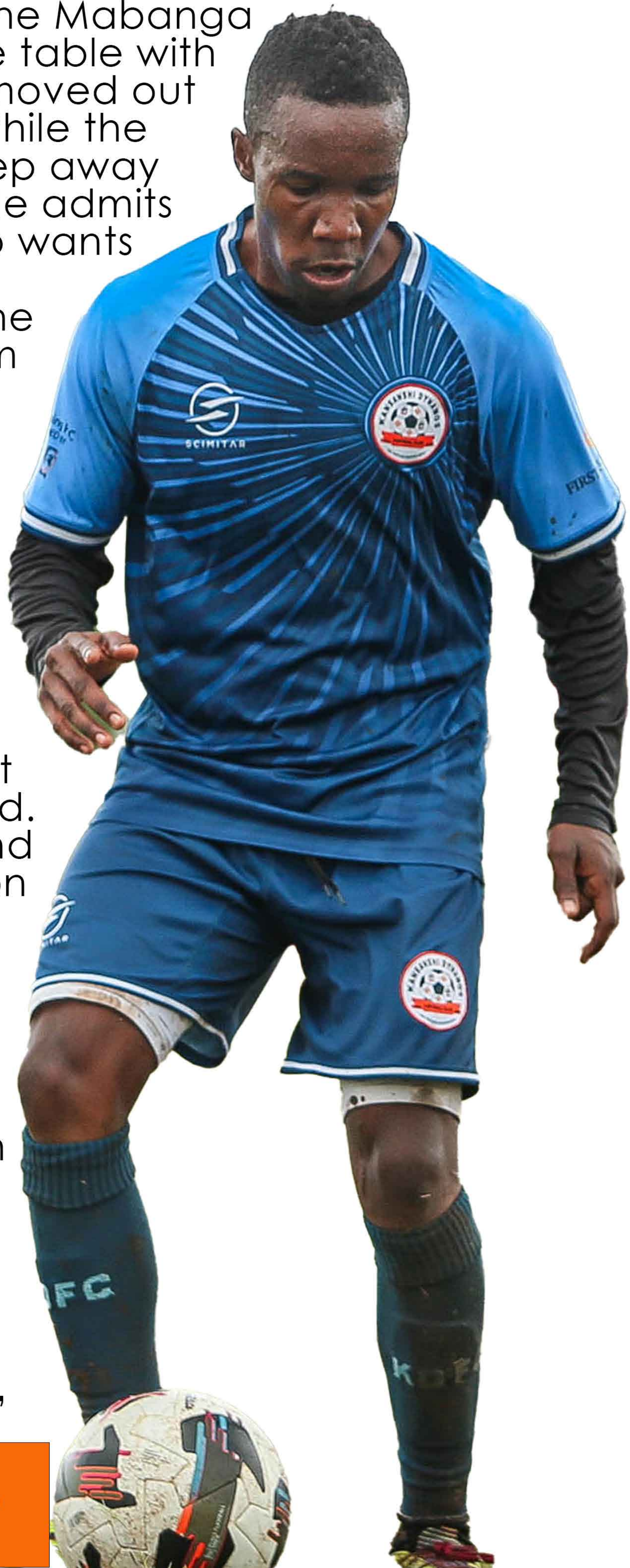
“We know we are not in the position we want as a team and as a club, but the important thing is that everyone in the squad is pushing,” Lukonde said. The captain emphasised that the players remain determined to continue fighting for better results as the season progresses.

Lukonde also highlighted the strong spirit within the squad, adding that the players are working together to ensure the team finishes the season in a much stronger position.

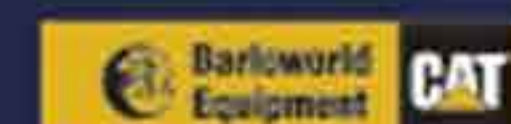

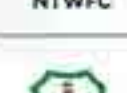

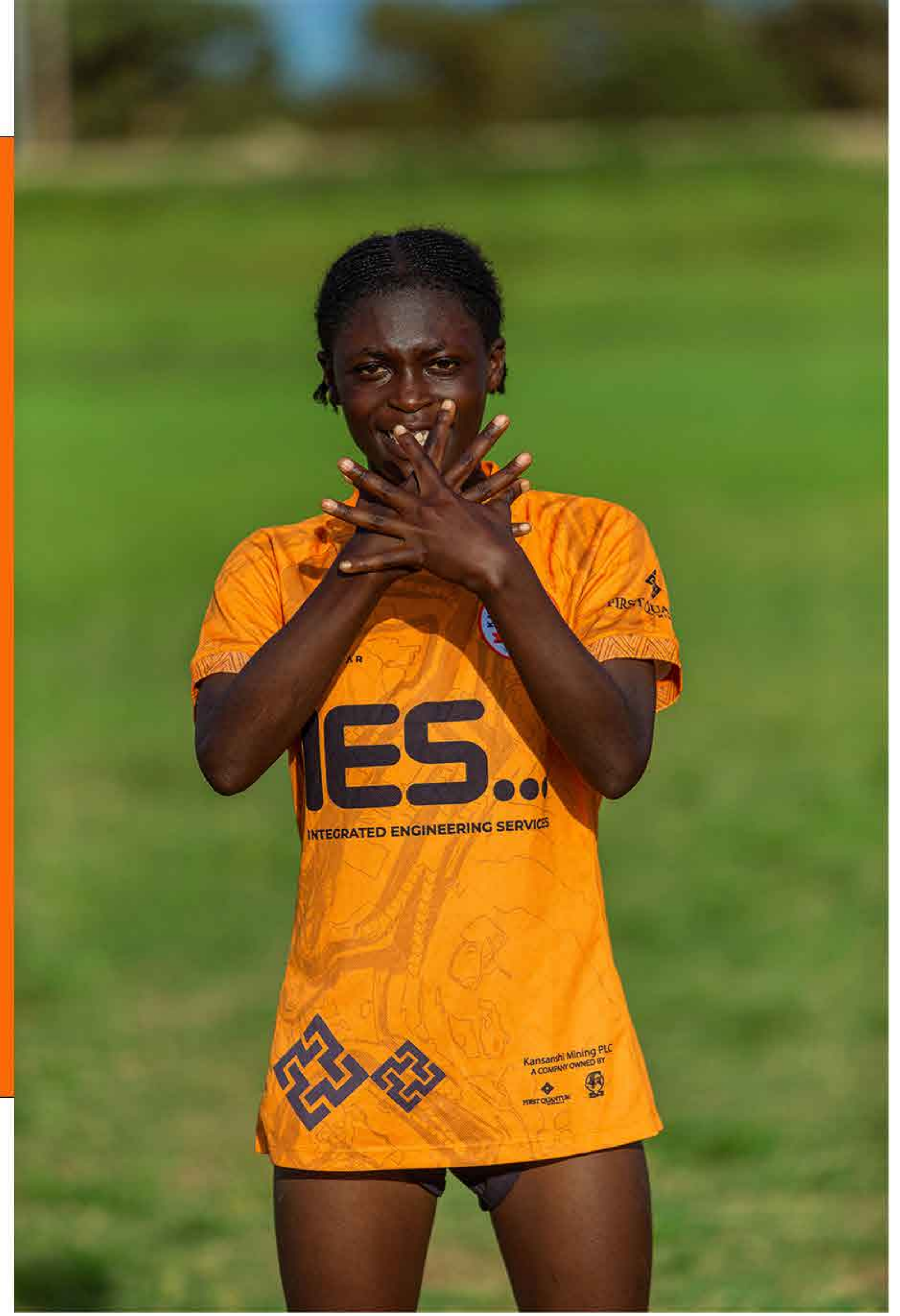

Docus Kupanda: A Young Dreamer Creating Chances for Kansanshi Queens



At just 17 years old, Docus Kupanda is steadily establishing herself as one of the most promising young players at Kansanshi Queens. The talented attacker, who hails from Kimsala in Solwezi, is the fourth-born in a family of five children and recently completed her secondary education while continuing to grow her football career.

Docus joined Kansanshi Queens in 2019 from Joma Queens, and since arriving at the club she has developed into one of the team's most creative attacking players. This season she has already contributed two goals and six assists, currently holding the highest number of assists in the squad, an indication of her vision and ability to create opportunities for her teammates.

For Docus, being part of Kansanshi Queens represents more than football, it represents opportunity. Coming from a modest background, she understands the value of the support that makes women's football possible and is quick to acknowledge the role sponsorship plays in helping young girls like her pursue their dreams.

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"We really appreciate the sponsors for supporting football. Having this club helps us as young girls because it gives us opportunities we would not have had."

Her journey at Kansanshi Queens has also been closely connected to her education. The club environment allowed her to balance school and football, something she says required discipline and determination. With training sessions often scheduled after school hours, she was able to continue her studies while developing her football skills.

"I was received very well at Kansanshi. The club has supported me a lot, even with school. Now I am done with my secondary education."

Growing up in Solwezi, Docus says football has provided her with a positive environment and direction. Spending time at the stadium and on the training ground helps keep her focused and away from negative influences.

"Being at the stadium feels great. Instead of doing other bad things, I prefer coming for football because it keeps me busy and helps me stay away from bad vices."

Her commitment on the pitch has not gone unnoticed. Through her performances with Kansanshi Queens, Docus has had the opportunity to represent Zambia at youth level as part of the Under-20 national team, an experience that has broadened her ambitions and strengthened her desire to succeed in the sport.

Inspired by Zambian football stars such as Barbra Banda and Racheal Kundananji, Docus dreams of taking her career even further. She hopes to one day follow in their footsteps by playing professional football at the highest level and ultimately competing in Europe.

Despite the challenges that many young athletes face, Docus says she is fortunate to have strong support from her family. Her parents have encouraged her passion for football and continue to stand behind her ambitions.

With her father currently unemployed, the small allowances she receives through football also help support her family at home, something she takes great pride in. For Docus, contributing to her parents while pursuing her dream adds even greater meaning to her journey in football.



Off the pitch, she is already becoming a source of inspiration for younger girls in her community who often approach her to ask whether they too can become footballers. Docus encourages them to believe in themselves and to stay disciplined both in school and in sport.

Alongside her football ambitions, she also admires the discipline and commitment of the military and hopes that one day she may have the opportunity to serve her country in that capacity as well.

Still only at the beginning of her career, Docus Kupanda represents the spirit and purpose of Kansanshi Queens, a platform that empowers young women through football while creating opportunities that extend far beyond the pitch. Her journey reflects the real impact that investment in women's football can have, not only for individual players but also for their families and communities.
